**01.** The event "Online Seminar for GASU Teachers on the Development of Electronic Teaching Materials on the Example of the SUNRAISE Courses" was organized by Gorno-Altaisk State University (P7) on April 07, 2020, for GASU colleagues from the Faculty of History and Philology.

**03.** The event was organized in response to requests from the Faculty of History and Philology. Due to COVID-19 the university had to switch to distance learning and many colleagues experienced difficulties in organizing e-learning process for their students. Thus, the aim of the seminar was to share experience in developing online teaching resources based on the SUNRAISE outcomes. For other colleagues from the Faculty of Natural Sciences and Geography individual consultations were also provided.

**04.** Olga Zhuravleva presented e-learning modules from three courses and a MOOC developed under the Project:

- Environmental Design and Expertise;
- Waste Management;
- Sustainable Development of Mountain Territories; and
- Sustainable Development of Mountain Territories in the Context of the Concept of Ecosystem Services (MOOC).

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She also explained how to create voice over narration for a PowerPoint presentation, what online tools can be used for making educational videos, and shared her personal experience, including the challenges she faced while using online modules in teaching.

**05.** The participants of the seminar thanked the organizer, commented on the usefulness of the information presented, and suggested including the report on the SUNRASE outcomes in the meeting agenda of the Academic Council of Gorno-Altaisk State University (has already been scheduled for November 2020).

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
